DEACON RETREAT CANCELLATION POLICY

Deacon Retreat Cancellation Policy: When a deacon needs to cancel attending a retreat within a week of the retreat date, there are still costs incurred by the retreat center and charged to our office. To be prudent stewards of Church funds, some or all of your assessment will not be available to be applied to a different retreat in the same year.

- If you cancel during the last week before the retreat but no later than 4 p.m. on the day before it begins (Thursday), we will be charged \$105/person. If you and your wife were registered, you will reduce your available funds for a replacement retreat that year by \$210, leaving only \$140 left.
- If you cancel the day the retreat starts, we will be charged the full \$350 and have no further diocesan funds to apply to your mandatory annual retreat.

While unexpected illness or accidents may legitimately cause a last-minute cancellation, scheduling conflicts, even with your parish, should have been anticipated. Please ensure your availability to attend before scheduling a retreat so as not to incur any financial penalty.

INTRODUCTION & OVERVIEW

Jubilee 2025 invites you to be a pilgrim of hope. For Christians, hope is anchored in the encounter with Jesus whose life, death, and resurrection reveals God's transforming love. Our hope in God is renewed constantly in the gift of the Holy Spirit, the love of the Father and the Son, who is given, even now, to the community of believers.

The Holy See has designated a number of Jubilee Days throughout 2025 to recognize and celebrate different groups of people and various ministries in the Church. The Jubilee of Deacons will be held from Friday, February 21, to Sunday, February 23, 2025; however, these resources can be used for engaging and celebrating deacons at any time throughout the Jubilee Year. In the Catholic Church, the diaconate is one of three degrees in ordained ministry bishops, priests, and deacons. Since the Second Vatican Council, the Latinrite Church has restored the diaconate "as a proper and permanent rank of the hierarchy". Deacons preparing for the priesthood are transitional deacons, while those not planning to be ordained priests permanent deacons. Permanent are diaconate can be conferred on a single or married man. If he is married, he must be so before receiving the diaconate.


Lumen Gentium, after describing the function of presbyters as a participation in the priestly function of Christ, illustrates the ministry of deacons, "upon whom", it says, "hands are imposed not unto the priesthood, but unto a ministry of service." The Sacred Order of Deacons is to be a "driving force for the Church's service or toward the local diakonia Christian communities and as a sign or sacrament of the Lord Christ himself, who 'came not to be served but to serve." This is at the very heart of the diaconate to which you have been called: to be a servant of the mysteries of Christ and, at one and the same time, to be a servant of your brothers and sisters. That these two dimensions are inseparably joined together in one reality shows the important nature of the ministry which is yours by ordination.

But this Jubilee Year calls us to do more than attend events and take pilgrimages. To truly celebrate this year as God and the Church intends is for all of us to be Living Icons of Hope. People are looking for signs of hope these days, and in desperation can look for hope among human institutions. But that is not where hope lies. Hoping that any particular person or institution is the answer to address our fear or despair is a false hope. As deacons we must always direct our focus and that of those to whom we minister to our one true Hope in God, who created us and maintain us with His Love. We are called to relate to all God's children with the Mercy and Love of God with which Jesus entrusted us. If we find ourselves engaging others with whom we disagree with anger or judgment we are being false prophets, counter to Jesus's Gospel. Let us all rededicate ourselves this year to being true servants of God's Kingdom as Icons of Hope!

TRIBUNAL Advocate Needed

RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

- Explaining the annulment process to petitioners
- Assisting and representing parishioners before the Marriage Tribunal by introducing petitions for Declarations of Nullity on their behalf
- Recording petitioner testimonies and acting as the liaison between petitioners and the Marriage Tribunal
- Updating pastors regarding cases from their parishes
- Assisting OCIA directors in determining marital status of candidates and catechumens
- Maintaining a close working relationship with the Marriage Tribunal Staff



The Advocate should possess an understanding and training in the annulment process in the Catholic Church as well as an understanding of the theology of the Sacrament of Marriage.

"But in order that the liturgy may be able to produce its full effects, it is necessary that the faithful come to it with proper dispositions, that their minds should be attuned to their voices, and that they should cooperate with divine grace lest they receive it in vain. Pastors of souls must therefore realize that, when the liturgy is celebrated, something more is required than the mere observation of the laws governing valid and licit celebration; it is their duty also to ensure that the faithful take part fully aware of what they are doing, actively engaged in the rite, and enriched by its effects" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 11).




